Why is DNSH crucial for RDAs?



Regulatory context

The "Do No Significant Harm" (DNSH) principle is mandatory for projects funded by European programs like MRR and FEDER, ensuring that activities do not harm the EU's environmental objectives.





The verification of the Do No Significant Harm (DNSH) principle ensures that any proposed activities or measures comply with environmental sustainability standards. This process involves assessing whether the activity significantly harms any of the six key environmental objectives outlined in the EU Taxonomy Regulation (Regulation (EU) 2020/852). These objectives include climate change mitigation, climate change adaptation, sustainable use and protection of water and marine resources, transition to a circular economy, pollution prevention and control, and protection and restoration of biodiversity and ecosystems. Verification is essential to confirm alignment with EU sustainability criteria and prevent funding for environmentally harmful actions.
